

Candidates for long-term internships in the context of a HEurope project (GreenME)

The Barcelona Lab for Urban Environmental Justice and Sustainability (BCNUEJ) is part of the Institute of Environmental Science and Technology (ICTA) at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB). The BCNUEJ is an interdisciplinary, feminist and caring research group, aiming to contribute to just, sustainable and healthy cities.

We build on urban planning, public health, public policy, urban geography, and urban and environmental sociology, to analyze the extent to which urban plans and policy decisions contribute (or not) to healthy and sustainable cities for all. To do so, we focus on putting the needs of underprivileged residents at the center of our research. Our research is organized in different research lines. We are currently looking for candidates interested in an internship in the context of the “Urban environment, health and equity” line.

What we are looking for:

We are seeking long-term interns (minimum 12 weeks) within the context of a HEurope funded project (GreenME) to join our GreenME team at BCNUEJ. The GreenME project is a HEurope project that will: develop a comprehensive understanding of the current state of nature-based therapy (with their integration or not in healthcare systems) and green care in different study regions, provide new strong evidence regarding the degree to which and how specific nature-based therapies (and green care broadly) benefit mental health and wellbeing, empower green care actors to ensure the scaling-up of green care and its integration in healthcare systems. So, among others, GreenME will include interviews to different green care stakeholders, and semi-experimental studies and cross-sectional studies designed to evaluate the associations between exposure to nature and adults’ mental health, with a particular focus on evaluating the potential differences on these associations by gender. The project includes around 20 consortium partners in Europe and the US.

Location: Barcelona (Spain)

Key responsibilities:

Key responsibilities will vary depending on internship period and student interests, as an example:

- Spring 2024: semi-structured interviews and policy document analyses in Spain and US context
- Summer 2024: develop protocols to evaluate nature-based therapy interventions, and possible wrap-up from Spring 2024
- Autumn 2024, winter 2024-25: participate in the evaluation of nature-based therapy interventions, GIS work, development of surveys, recruitment of participants in Spain and the US

Mandatory eligibility criteria:

- Willing to commit to an internship of at least 12 weeks
- Being able to get external funding for the internship (e.g. PKG, Erasmus +, etc.) or completing the internship as a mandatory requirement for degree attainment.
- High motivation to work on interdisciplinary teams and to engage in intersectoral work
- Advanced English level, written as well as oral
- Autonomy
- Good organizational skills
- Good team member

What do we offer:

An exciting, young, transdisciplinary and international research environment with ample opportunities for exchange with scholars from related disciplines and learn from others at the universities and research institutes in the BCNUEJ, ICTA-UAB and consortium, including local partner organizations and local stakeholders.
